

Thirty three local men gave their lives in two world wars and their names are recorded on our memorial. Every year on Remembrance Sunday, we come together at our War Memorial in Seale & Sands to remember them. But their names are fading...

As the nation commemorates the centenary of the close of the First World War, we have an opportunity to preserve their names, their memory and their sacrifice for the next generation. **Will you remember them?**

In 1918 a committee was formed to agree a design and position and appoint a stone mason for the memorial. Their mandate included raising of the funds to pay for the memorial by public subscription, as was the way all other memorial structures were funded at the time. They were also tasked with appointing trustees to maintain the memorial for the future. The Parish Council have acted for some time as custodians of the memorial and we too need the help of residents to fund the cleaning work.

Our community came together to build this War Memorial, now we need to work together again to save it



Our aim is to raise a total of £5,000 to clean and conserve the War Memorial on Seale Lane, by St Laurence's Church, Seale. The Seale & Sands Parish Council, through Council Member Jason Butcher, have applied and been granted approximately £2,250 from the War Memorial Trust and the Council have offered a further £250 to aid with expenses.

Every gift, no matter how large or small, will make a difference, and a gift of £150 will preserve a name on our memorial.

Richard Rogers Conservation is an Accredited Conservator-Restorer with the Institute of Conservation (ACR) with over 35 years experience, based in Leatherhead. He is approved by the War Memorial Trust as one of a small number of conservators able to carry out these works, since the memorial was listed in 2015. The works are estimated to take two weeks.
